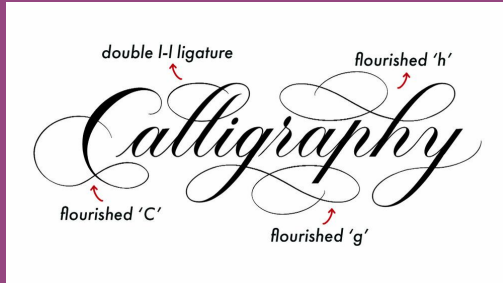

Copperplate is a beautiful flowing script which was used as early as the sixteenth century and is commonly used today in formal correspondence for weddings. Explore the basic strokes for creating traditional copperplate calligraphy as well as techniques to develop a more relaxed or modern style of script.

The first class will cover lowercase letters. An exemplar will be provided for self study of uppercase letters.

In the second class, we will practice some simple flourishes and basic layout techniques to create a greeting card project.

Supplies are provided during the class.

If you have ever thought of learning about fused art glass as a hobby, join us for a fun starter class! Select your choice of colors to make pretty unique suncatchers or plant stakes to keep or



give for a gift! In this beginner workshop, you will learn the very basics of kiln fused glass work. Topics discussed will be safety, glass compatibility, glass colorings, types of glass, tools needed, kiln information and fusing glass retailers.

Demonstrations of how to score and break glass, layout and design suggestions. This is a hands on class! Your

art pieces will be fired and annealed in a digital kiln at Palm Cottage Glass Studio and brought back to Harlem Arts Council for pick up at your convenience. Suncatchers may be displayed tabletop with a provided clear stand or I will drill holes with a diamond bit studio drill press and add a crystal chain, for easy hanging, your choice. Pictures depict the crystal chain.

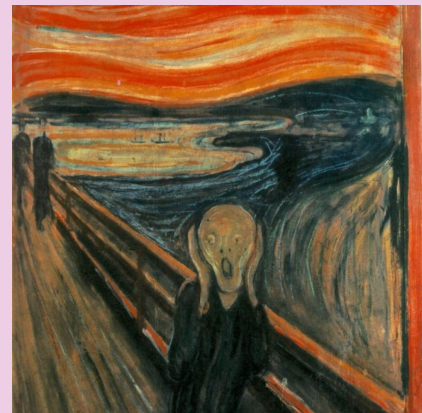
